My Dear Sir

I am in rec^t. of yours
of 15th Inst and Enclosures. I had
previously sent my best General
Plan to Mr. Carman with a re-
quest that he would place upon it
all existing Rights up to date.
I now enclose it with his additions
upto 19th Inst. and you will observe
Parkinson has taken up nearly
all the possible Rights towards
Glengarry as well as on nearly all
the other Areas. Mr. Carman has
also included all the Contiguous
Rights not embraced in our Areas.
I also enclose the Plan you return-
ed to me with the proposed new
"miles to work" in case you should
want to alter any of them after
inspecting Carmans additions
on the General Plan.

I am too much engaged to be able to make you a copy of these Plans. Please return them under Regista Cover as soon as you are done with them. You will observe Mr Carmichael places the mile to work on No. 108. in a different position from what I pencilled it as instructed by S. H. Holmes but as our other right to search there does not expire until next June there will be time enough by then to select another mile. We notice the piece you have marked off in the S. E. corner of 48. Mr. Holmes is now in Halifax but he told us lately there was no reserved land there to take up. I have no personal knowledge however of that fact. On looking at the mile which you have laid out surrounding No. 8. I think there will be a difficulty in getting it especially as the East line of No. 8. is the line of Mentworth Grant.

You have marked a portion on the north side of 408.
& a portion on the south side of 408. there is no way of
connecting them in one application but by embracing
a portion of W. Grant & we cannot get a mile laid out
exceeding 2 miles in length being the utmost extent
in length allowed by law.

You will observe the Area adjoining 121
at Culler, has now only one Right on it Rev^d Don McRae
& that 123 & 124 are vacant. would be worth while for
the parties interested in 121 to take out a Right on
122 123 & 124.

I sent the map of Coal areas at South^s.
Point. of which you have a copy, to the Minis office
asking Curran to plot on it any additional Rights
now existing. He has returned it to me without any
alteration & I take it for granted the Rights there at

19th Just remain as on the Plan you have in your
possession.
