I am in daily expectation of a
second proof, and have written
him to day, to know when I
shall get it. I had informed
him previously that I should see it
on my arrival in London, but
now it must be sent me here.

I have instructed Stanford to
ascertain from Mess^{rs} Hodder & Co when
it would be required.
