Principal Dawson.

My dear Sir,

I have this morning
your note of the 5th inst. relative to the
Newspaper Rumour about the Alaska
Boundary and reminding me that my
old companion G. H. Dawson will be
available for his new expedition. Of
course he would be offered the position
of Geologist. I have no reason to
suppose that anything is being done
in the general question, as I have
heard nothing official about it, and



consequently conclude that it is
 merely a newspaper rumour. Any
 action in this matter will originate
 at Ottawa, and I shall be glad if
 you will enquire among your friends there
 who are likely to know, whether it is
 probable the work will be undertaken
 immediately. The United States
 would certainly not be ready till
 after next summer, as their principal
 officers are coming over to inspect
 in May to wind up the work of the
 present Commission. Our Commissioner
 Major Cameron arrived in Ireland today

but I have not yet seen him.

I shall be very glad to hear
if you have any recent news of E. M. D.,
and if there is any chance of his
being at Montreal this winter.
