

Cambridge Dec. 16, 1875

My dear Sir

I meant soon to have relieved
your mind of any fear of mis-
understanding about the Frayer River
fossil insects, but I have been very
busy. Mr Dawson wrote me that
his disposition of them was subject
to Mr Selwyn's consent & therefore
I expected to wait until he had
gained it - It seems therefore that
it would be better to leave it
in that way as I had already
written you on when I wrote
you - There is no hate in the
matter of course and I would
prefer to leave the matter in
Mr Dawson's hands.

Have corrected one proof of
the slip on Carboniferous Megriapod
& hope soon to send you the paper &
the cut -

The MS. of the short paper
on the Cape Boston fossil went, with
the cut, to W Putnam Longfoss;
but I have not yet received
any proof of the paper - I asked
him for an electrotype for you -

When he returns from Washington
I will write him again. I
put a short note in the Boston
Society's Proceedings about the
mineral but that is all that has
been published -
