My dear Dr Dawson.

Mr Borland called on me Monday morning - had not been informed by our Secretary of his appointment to write the paper. I explained what we desired and this noon have rec^d the paper herewith sent. I doubt the propriety of the criticisms in regard to the Judge: also the parenthesis about the action of the Seminary during the rebellion: also of supposing motives in one or two instances. I suppose the facts may be depended upon, as we have had them before this time in the journals, and none have contradicted.
