yesterday. I shall look
forward with interest to
the publication of the Geo-
logical Survey Report and
your notes on the fossils

from the M. Melton Grit
Openings have recently been
made upon the Lowry
(H) from as described
near the Sch. Pond workings
and I am endeavoring
to obtain a collection of
fossils from that horizon
which may possess interest
as being intermediates be-
tween the Emory, pretty
fully represented and

known by McCall to be the
first seam above the Mill-
stone Grit and the Le Cross
or Cossett seams determined
to be actually within it.

My previous and
crude ideas of the Cornbray
North region have been
entirely upset by observing
the structure and dips of
the rocks to the N.W. of
that region, but I am cred-
ably informed that my
rule fixation stands ex-
actly at a broad diversion

at Warraragi's Lake and
far below the horizon of
Cassio's Pit.

Considerable interest is
excited by the discovery of
Copper ore in considerable
quantities W. of Gabarus
bay in the old rocks of the
coast. It is a Pyrites ore
and occurs in rock almost
identical with that containing
the little cubes of "Maudie"
sent with the specimens last
summer. I am dear Sir
