rich indeed.

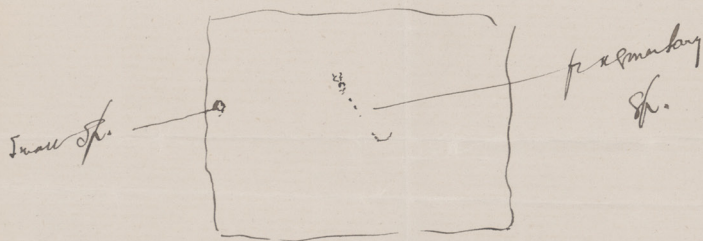
