My paper describing some of the forms you refer to was crowded out of the last volume of the Royal Soc. Can. Trans. so will go over to the next. The Myriapods will be in the paper I propose to read next week. There is also an Arachnid allied to Archimartus and a Springtail not yet described and some others more fragmentary - That puzzling little thing which I referred doubtfully to the crusta (Crypterella) seems I now think is probably the abdomen of a Pedipalp. Amphipeltis I referred to is probably an Arachnid only in a broad sense, not as being a scorpion. Dr Woodward has described a large tuberculate fossil, thus referred, from the English Carbonif. Another is known from German Coal formation. A new insect wing was described in my article of last spring which is still in manuscript for the reason above referred to: the species is named
