Platyctonus.

No 1. Looks somewhat ~~like~~ Prokallus-like.

2. This and another, seem at times associated with Parha, may they be sac-like coverings of same?!

3. Is the cast of any fine Prokallus? These seem to have an appearance of a hexagonal form of outward wall. A Parha-like appearance is minimal. Some of the others are rounded bodies, with a more flattened form than the spec. of Prokallus, and perhaps more of a carbonaceous appearance.
