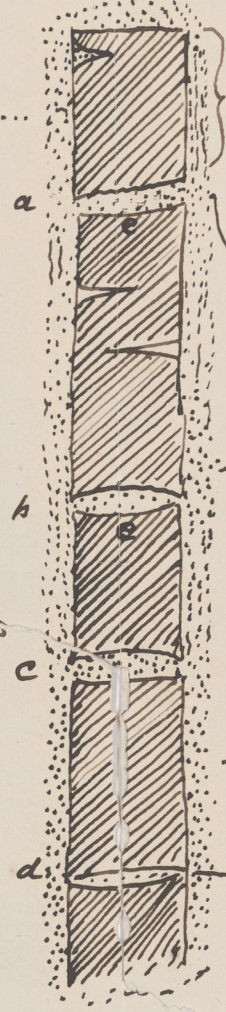

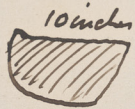

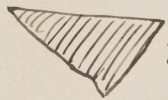

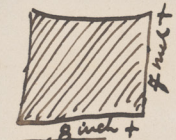

The impression is divided into
four part by septa of sandstone
a b c d. The surface of the
mould is marked by irregular
lozenge shaped protuberances +
corrugation, and is coated with
a black film. I have sent a
few fragments. The markings on
the surface of the septa are
somewhat like the impression
of ~~coarse~~ ^{the ends} bundles of coarse
fibres. There are specimens
of this kind of marking.
The surface of the septa
is also covered with a black
film.
The septa are not organic.
The impression is entirely empty.

On the same rock is another impression of which the accompanying fig-
will give an idea.



The upper part is a very deep embossing about 2/3 the circumference of tree.

The lower part is indistinct.

Just above these two is another cylindrical mould
14 inches long + 9 wide.
