that he had found a few
shells (Lingula) in strata
at Bras d'Or which he takes
to be identical with those of

The Southern Coast.

A piece of this nature
has prevented me up to
the present from making
any progress towards
the Straits to Gabaras
but I still hope to be able
to accomplish something
in this direction before the
winter sets in.

I notice in Harper that
Mr Sadler has published
the results of his examina-
tions of the fossil insect
from C. B. but have not
seen them I am desirous
to see them very faithfully yours
