Dear Sir William,

In reply to yours of 12th inst. I beg leave to call your attention to a few notes on graptolites collected from Eastern Canada & New Brunswick especially, published in our Reports.

(1) In "Report of Progress" for 1879-80. pp. 23 & 24 Dr Ellis refers to graptolites from Pête à Gauche river - but no species had been determined from that locality - at that time so that none are mentioned. Dr Ellis mentions however that his impression was at the time & now that they belong to the same horizon as those on the Marsouin River. These graptolites are now in Prof. Lapworth's hands who will report on them in the near future.

(2) In Prof. Bailey's report "Annual Report" Vol. I. p. 15 G. (1885); where you will see that there are (Upper) Silurian graptolites mentioned.
