

Mount of Copper no Specimens

- No. 1. A specimen from No 2 pit where the vein is 11 feet across. This specimen shows the general character of this part of the Lode.
- " 2. Part of lode immediately overlying the Lode. From No 2 pit.
- " 3. Ore and gangue from decomposed crop of Lode.
- " 4.
- " 5. Shows gangue carrying ore, from No 1 pit. In this pit there is a good part of the gangue, that is not nearly as well filled, as the whole band is in No 2 pit, but good ore is found all the way down. It often occurs in layers sometimes extending from one wall, sometimes from the other, what there is seems

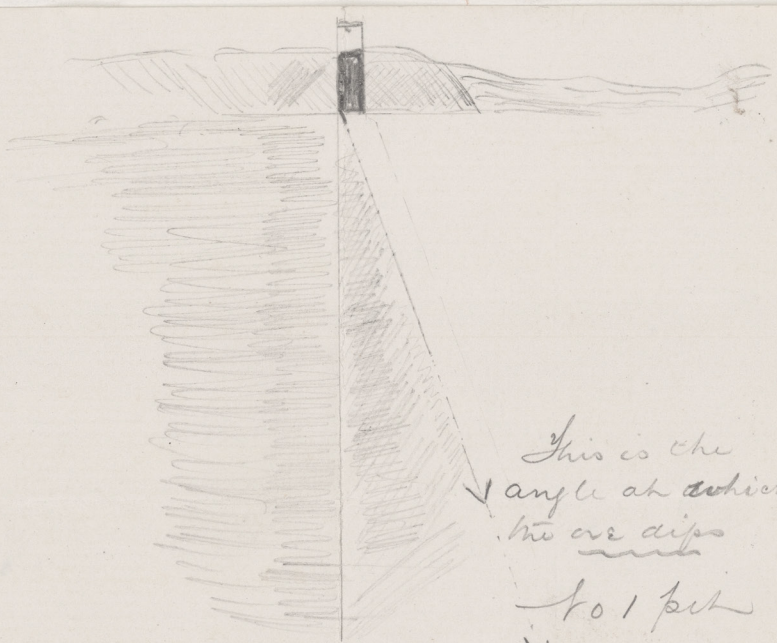
