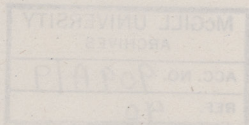
My dear Sir

I have your note of 29 I would have written to you yesterday, but I was in hopes of being in a position to comply with your request to settle the matter with Prentiss - I would do so at once & destroy the letter, if I had the money to do it with - but at present I have not. -

I would acknowledge that it is my intention to hold you harmless in this matter - and that I am very much obliged to you for your offer of assistance - And if I cannot do better may accept it - I would like to get out next week when I can see Ramsay & endeavor to get Prentiss to take my note for the Amos!

Have also put off taking any proceedings for a few days, as I am unable to do much at present - but hope that will be all right to the first of the week
