My dear Sir

My Mother has asked
me to reply to your letter of
the 23rd Nov^r which she received
a few days ago & in which you
tell her of your desire to write
a Memoir of my late Uncle, Sir
W. F. Logan, & ask her to furnish
any letters or information that
she can with respect to his early
life -

any letters that we have of his
we shall be glad to send you
with the understanding that they
are to be returned eventually &
only to be used in the way you
mention but we have very few
to send —

My Uncle wrote very little to
his own family, (except occasionally
on business) & when he did write
it was generally to Mr. Hart Logan
& his letters were burnt in the Pan-
technicon when it was destroyed
by fire —

We have a few letters written to

Mr. James Logan by him, chiefly
from England, but some when he
was on the Survey & we have a
Journal kept by him in 1843.

The Journal I will despatch today
but the letters I will keep for

a little, till I look through
some packets of family corres-
pondence which may possibly
contain some from Sir William.

Of course you have the Newspaper
notices that were written at the
time of his death — we thought
them very correct —

Mrs Gower thought the
account of Sir W. E. Logan
in the Canadian Illustrated
News of July 10th 1875 - very
good -
