SIR,

I beg to inform you that the Council of the Royal Society have decided on the following arrangement for the Administration of the Fund of £4000 placed at their disposal by the Government for the promotion of Scientific Investigation.

1. To initiate or carry on investigations, and to provide for their being carried out, whether by conferring grants on competent persons, or by offering prizes of considerable value for the solution of problems.
2. To consider applications from persons desirous of undertaking investigations.
3. To apply funds for computation, the formation of Tables of Constants, and other laborious and unremunerative Scientific work.
