Newfoundland has been essentially a fishing country for the past two or three centuries, yet the ignorance that up to this day exists even amongst those most directly interested in them is deplorable. That ignorance was not peculiar to us in Newfoundland. A year or two ago he (Mr. H.) being in England made an effort to obtain some information regarding the habits of the cod, and to that end applied to one of the highest authorities on such matters in Great Britain, Mr. Frank Buckland, to whom he had been juroduced.
