My dear Sir

Immediately after the receipt of your note (dated 2 days later than the last meeting held by the Protestant (union) - in fact the printing was finished on the day after the Committee's Minutes of Meeting were received - we began the circulation of the lists of authorized text-books - & also sent out to the Inspectors at the same time, the "Special Instructions" - Doubtless the Inspectors themselves have by this time made the list known to many of the teachers - but it is intended to have the list in the hands of all the

members of School Boards, School Visitors, Teachers & others concerned in public education in the Protestant & English Institutions - It will take time to have the list fully circulated, as, to save expense, it is enclosed with the Communications ^{sent} made from day to day to parties corresponding with the Department. I think that, before July 1st, the circulation will be as complete as it can be made by means of any endeavours on our part -
