The faculty were empowered to draw up for the consideration of the Council regulations for proceedings in divinity and schedules of the subjects of examination.

At the same meeting the Bursar reported that the fees and boarding charges, with the endowments, were just sufficient to meet current expenses of tuition, board, ordinary repairs, and insurance, but not to meet a sum of \$900 required to defray the interest on \$10,000 given to the chair of Ecclesiastical History, now temporarily invested in the buildings, and other obligations, and that if, as is hoped, funds may be obtained for the removal of these, that amount would still be removal of these, that amount would still be required for increasing the efficiency of the in stitution. It was also resolved for the simplification of the accounts, which at present for the same term have to appear in two bills, to require that \$80 be lodged for each boarder with the Bursar as caution money, to remain in his hands till the boarder is withdrawn, and that in this case the bills be sent out at the close of the term, so as to include all items for the term instead of being sent out as at present at the close of the first month of the term.
