Dear Sir

I have now at Mr Selwyn's request just finished preparing a case of Oregon specimens for the Paris Exhibition, and before packing them up I should like to know if you wish to have your "Garden of Life" placed in the case as at Philadelphia - The case looks nice and I hope it will attract the attention as at Philadelphia. The copy you sent to me at Philadelphia is now in the Library of the Survey - where it was placed by Mr Selwyn. I have one packet of the circulars Messrs Dawson Bros sent to me for distribution at the Centennial. Shall I send them?

Many new facts with regard to the

Euston Township Ecks has come to light this past summer. I have collected fossils in a many places in both Lewis, Lanzeron and Sillery they range from the Potsdam to the Hudson River. The Potsdam forms are only found in the pebbles of the conglomerates. The Obolus and fucrias range all through the Lewis Lanzeron and Sillery and Graptolites have been found in what has been made as Potsdam.

I hope next year to be allowed to go over a portion of the highly altered Ecks south of Leeds. Ecks which Dr Selwyn places at or below the Rhinoceros Group. I think fossils will be yet found that will show these to be higher.
