My dear D. Dawson

When you last wrote to me  
you referred to the small account  
between you & I, and I promised to  
make it out & send it if spared  
to the beginning of the year. I now  
redeem my pledge and enclose it.

hope made it up, to 31 Dec last.

I have read through your work,

"The origin of the world according to  
Revelation Science" and have been much  
interested in the subjects of which it treat-  
one perusal is quite insufficient to satisfy  
me, and I intend (D.V.) to read it carefully  
again. If spared to do so, I shall  
be better able to weigh the evidence for  
the conclusions at which you have arrived,  
so far as positive conclusions can be estab-
