I send you by mail to day the Cin Quar Jour Sci and a paper on the Strepomatidae - I regret that I have no bound copies of the Jour to send in return for so finely bound a work as the Acadian Geology - I will send you hereafter such matters of Natural History as may be published in this City - Mr Caleb Sturtevant described and figured a fossil under the name of Terebratula pennata in 1820 in vol 3 Am. Jour Sci - afterwards in 1841 Conrad described the same fossil as Selthyris mucronatus and the fossil is now generally known as Spirifera mucronata I propose to restore

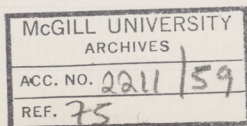

the name of Spirifera pennata and  
because this specific name was pre-  
occupied I propose for it the name  
of Spirifera atwaterana. This matter  
will soon be published. As there cannot  
be a shadow of doubt about ~~Atwater's~~  
species, and his figure is excellent there  
can be no reason for its suppression —  
I have written this because you may have a  
curiosity or desire to look at it —
