

Pictou 15th April 1878.

My dear Sir

I wrote you on 11th Feb^y respecting the sale by my father for you of the Moose River property. On the 4th Ult^o Fraser came up and an Agreement was Executed by him and my father as your attorney selling him the land for \$200. I explained in my letter to you of 11th Feb^y that Fraser had paid \$50 on a/c which sum was included in the acct. I ^{then} sent you. On 4th Ult^o he paid \$40 more being second instalment in advance. Left \$10 the balance is payable as follows,
\$60. on 1st October ~~this year~~ 1880
+ \$50 remaining, on 1st Oct^r 1881
and he is to get no Deed until the money is all paid. The Agreement was written out by
