Dear Sir.

Of the species of fossil plants which you have described from the Devonian measures of the U. S., I know only the list which is published in the Seventh Annual Report of the University of New York and the species described in the fifth annual Report of the Agriculture of Maine, p. 248 & 251. I have seen in a catalogue of pamphlets for sale, a Supplement to the Devonian plants of the U. S. by yourself and immediately demanded it from Mr. Cannon by whom it was offered for sale; but I could not obtain it. If it is not too much trouble to you, I should be sincerely obliged for a communication of a note concerning the U. S. fossil plants which you may have described besides what is in that Maine Report. If you should not know where the document is obtainable, perhaps you would have

the kindness to lend me for one week
only, one of your copies, or if not possible
to have the descriptions copied by some
of your assistants at my cost, of course. I
should then like to have the reference to
the books or memoirs where your ^{U.S.} species
are described. - Except this, I think that
I have all the memoirs and works which
you have published, where fossil plants of
Canada are described, including the supplements
to the last edition of the *Acadian Geology*.
