Dear Dr. Dawson

I have never seen  
Mr. Sinclair, nor am I aware  
of having given him or any  
one for him to understand  
that I have any objections  
to his being paid for all  
the services he rendered to the  
S.S. Union. I objected to the  
payment to him of two months  
salary as it appeared to me  
at first sight in the Cash Book;  
when, however, I came to under-  
stand that the Union would  
not be called upon to pay  
anything more for its share

of the current expenses of the  
Depositary, the matter had  
quite another aspect and  
I made no further objections.

I told Mr. Munro when the  
stock was all removed that  
the S.S. Union had no further  
need of Mr. Sinclair's services  
nor of any assistance in  
the Depositary as heretofore.  
I have not yet found time  
to have a meeting with the  
Committee of the Bible Socy  
with reference to the Ac which  
that Socy has against the  
S.S. Union. and I do not  
think I shall now be able  
to afford the time, for I

must give large attention  
to my own affairs in  
view of my probable early  
start for Scotland.

Mr Harris has had the  
books checked and balanced,  
and is now doing some-  
thing to the ac's.

I will therefore feel  
much obliged if you and  
the committee will please  
accept of the present as  
my resignation.
