Have you described Aethyteria  
ingens anywhere else than in Precambrian  
plants p. 55. Here you refer to fig. 206.  
which is merely exemplification. I believe  
that this A. of yours is A. macrophylla, Newb;  
A. maxima, Andr. both forms commonly  
found in separate leaflets from the base of  
the millstone grit to the Waverly group and  
Chert limestone. I have good figures of it.  
Perhaps you might have a small fragment  
to spare for examination. I would return  
it immediately. If, as I believe it is the  
same species as yours your name has  
precedence and should be preserved.
