Dear Principal Dawson

I shall take it as
a great favour if you will
kindly represent to the Board
of the Protestant-School Commission
the case of Raphael Noble, sexton
of Christ Church Cathedral. He
has at the present-time two
children attending the Sherbrook
Street-School; a boy of the age of

12 and a girl of 14. They have
been, I understand, attending
for some time, but now,
owing to their father having
removed some twenty yards
beyond the limits of the city,
they have been notified their
attendance must cease, as the
laws of the school will not
permit those living beyond
the limits of the city to enjoy
its privileges.

Now, I do not ask that
any of the laws of the Board
should be infringed, for I

doubt not there are good
reasons for them all, but
that inquiry be made whether
the really comes within the
provision of the law, and if
so, whether some other arrangement
could not be made by which
the children might enjoy the
vast advantages your schools
afford.
