My dear Sir,

I have discussed
the subject of your letter of
Dec 11th with Mr Carpenter;
and in the circumstances
what we propose is that
you should represent to the
Council of your Society

(1) that Mr Carpenter was

it would seem just that
your Society should give
another set of duplicates
as nearly equal to the
other as possible to
the Chicago Academy,
and we, on our
part, will give what
we can from the
remains of D. C.'s
collections, and such
