My dear Sir,

I observe a statement to the effect that representatives of the Medical Council of Ontario are in Ottawa with the view of asking the Government to aid them in their Chinese policy of excluding British Medical men from that Province. I hope the Govt will not listen to such a proposal. What we need is the recognition of our Medical degrees in England in

The Memorial of the University
forwarded ^{last year} by Lord Dufferin
and ~~praying~~ ^{asking} for that
privilege was favourably
entertained by the British
Medical Council and
was incorporated in their
new act, not yet passed
but which I hope will
yet become law.

If the Dominion
Parliament could abolish
the Medical Councils of

Ontario and Quebec
and established a General
Medical Board which
would be respected in
England and would
secure some uniformity here
the Medical Profession would
be greatly benefited.
