I met a friend the  
other day who told me that your  
paper on the microscopic structure of  
the Stromatopora was under print  
You were kind enough to promise me  
a copy when you had the printed  
sheets, for which I shall feel  
obliged - I sent you a specimen from  
the Clinton beds which may belong to  
the class Syringostoma, you were  
too much engaged at the time to  
note it. I enclose a couple of chips  
from what may be Stromatopora  
Hindei of Nicholson. (Zugora.) This  
is from a boulder from London  
and from other former lands with it  
I think is from the Comformans.  
It has some peculiar features  
the outer surface shows raised

were a ridge and the small  
is which come to the surface  
sharp angle seem to start from  
each side of these one ascending  
ridge. a Vertical section shows  
that it is not a solid mass but  
runs in loose joints meeting at  
certain points and then separating  
I can see nothing like a perfect column  
I send a little pencil sketch which  
of course is very imperfect. If you  
see any new points about it and  
would like to see the specimens  
I have, I will forward them to you  
for examination. Could you  
send me the names of the specimen  
from Marble Head and the one  
I sent you from Maldece  
having the dark and light wavy  
bands. I am afraid I put you  
to a good deal of trouble but  
I am much interested in these  
forms
