Dear Sir

Your letter of June 20th addressed to G.W. Robinson, Agent for the Intercolonial Railway has been sent to me for investigation, and I beg to enclose herewith a reply to our inquiries as to the circumstances at Point Levi. Will you be kind enough to let me know whether the statements made by Mr. Barber are correct.

Under ordinary circumstances the Railway people would not carry such articles as Personal Baggage, but I believe in the case of parties going to the Lower St. Lawrence in the summer they offer extra facilities there

There seems to be an error on the part of many in regard to the Express getting hold of such articles.

On this point I may say that it is not the Express Company who decide in what way such articles are to be forwarded. The Railway people decide all questions of this kind, and in case merchandise is offered it is delivered to the Express Company to forward.

In this case our object is to get the matter settled if possible to your satisfaction, and I would be glad to hear from you. Kindly return the enclosed letter.
