that this is so. But I do not
feel sure that the gravel
with worn broken shells
found at the base of Boopet
and a well maintained, were
due to the heat ofacial
subsidence. It may have
been so. But it may not.

I know no way which can
identify the gravel with
theacial subsidence. On
the contrary the fact of the
shells having been all
dead broken & transported
proves that they did not

live on the spot & see the one
found - as shells of the local
epoch generally can be traced
I have done where they are now
found. I think the transported
shells so common over the
country may have been due to
some later strata subsidence.

Quite close to
Parsipit I think I refer
in my article - one of the Wyl
level shells quite out of
the existing Ramer Valley - and
I have today taken large
pebbles of quartzite well
rolled which must have come
across England from Wales -
Let the Wyl is quite
superficial - and like that
in Wyl Wales.

Little weapons have been
found elsewhere.

The subject is very interesting
& has not yet been worked
out. I shall read with the
greatest interest anything you
may write upon the subject.

At present, politics
& other pursuits leave me
little or no time to follow
this particular enquiry.
