

Sir,

I have just returned from my search after Euripteras - I spent three days with a man to assist in the quarries and was rewarded with but one and some fragments.

I spent a couple of days last week after some large specimens - I knew of the conifers - and brought home a Phillips Asteria of three feet in diameter - another large coral (apparently) Michellina Intermittens about 2 1/2 ft - and some other fine specimens - I was also so fortunate as to obtain the largest Calymene I have seen it is four inches long and three wide -

The Euripteras is nearly whole - one of the (Asterias?) is wanting but most of the small arms are preserved - I have only seen one better -

Please say if I may send you a set including the large specimens I have described - and the Euripteras the latter must be high - when travelling expenses are included it will cost 30/- but I suppose you would not require many fragments - so I will make it 15/-

I have been offered ten dollars for the Trilobite - which I refused - but if you desire I will add it to the collection at that price - which will make the whole seventy five dollars -
