My dear W. Dawson

Yours of 17th is at hand. Having
just completed a study of the Dyrhapod
of Magnalock, I have been examining
the fragments from Sigillariae you sent
me again, completing the first cursory
view this morning. I think there are indi-
cations of a new form very different from
the old, as there are ^(of the old) of other things one
cannot possibly place. I want to go over
them again and then I shall be ready to send
them to you. ^{I doubt if I can get much out of them} Perhaps I would better wait
until I examine the new material you
promise, which I should be glad to see
as soon as possible because I now have an
artist who can draw them (and does it at
low prices) whom I may lose at any time.
I am having him draw all my palaeopic
material, which embraces a number of new forms.
