A LARGER BOARD IS NEEDED, IT MAY BE NECESSARY TO HAVE ONE MADE; AS OUR
LARGE BOARDS ARE ALL FIXED IN PLACE. SEVERAL SMALL ONES CAN EASILY BE
HAD, IF DESIRABLE.
