tive specimens that are  
either dolomitized or  
composed of calcite and  
dolomite - Small  
specimens or portions  
would do.

I suppose you may  
not have an example  
like that you described  
from Professor Bell's  
spare? - Another bit  
of Apatite would be  
useful.

I shall return you  
some of these another  
day. I had a paper at the  
Geological on another  
subject lately and had  
an appointment with Dr  
Carpenter to show him  
some of my slides, but I  
had a very bad accident  
and was obliged to return  
at once without seeing  
him - I was laid up  
for some weeks, but
