My dear Mr Lynch,

Within the last few weeks, Mr Heneker and myself, as well as the Comrs of Schools here and the Committee of the Normal School, have been studying the proposed school law. The more we do so, the more certain does it appear that it is in many respects very



revolutionary, and in nearly
all objectionable considered
as an attempt to codify
the old law. It requires
amendment and ab-
solute judgment to such an
extent that it should
be entirely recast. I think
nothing will suffice ex-
cept the work of a
competent law clerk
under your direction.
We shall have ready in

a short time a quantity
of suggestions as to details,
and propose to call
a meeting of the
Dist. Com. in such
time for the meeting
of Legislature. I should
be glad however if
you could communi-
cate with Mr. Bencher
or myself as to the
time when it will

be weeping & have some
suggestions ready, as
in the midst of
other business we may
delay too long.
