in Creswell Crags) and
Mr Hall (who accompanied
Professor Whitney but
did not agree in his
conclusions) and finally
a visitor - Mr S Charlesworth
(whose peculiar views, against
Hally's writ did not find
expression on this occasion.)

All were agreed as to
what Dr Southall said.

The friendly cooperation
of men like Professor Hughes
and Saurin, and
especially the death of Agassiz
near ten years ago quite
out of our reach. in fact
the latter ^{in 1871} wrote to say he
did not see the use of the
