My dear Do

Mr D. F. Fraser called on me today to see what the Union was doing as to the appointment of delegates to the International Convention at Toronto in June. He on behalf of the Presbyterian Assⁿ had communicated with the Secy of the Canada S. S. Assⁿ at Toronto who informed him that this Province was entitled to eleven (11) delegates and suggested that there should be concerted action by the various S. S. organizations in this Province as to their selection.

Mr Fraser thought that a joint meeting of the executive committees of the Presbyterian & Methodist Ass^{ns} with the leading men of the other denominations and the executive of the Union should be held to make

these appointments and have
them all go in the name
of the Union instead of the
several denominations to which
they belong it would probably
carry more weight and be
more in accordance with
the spirit of the convention.

This of course is only putting
the matter in a little more
definite form than the sug-
gestions made at our last
meeting.

I submit them to you as I
promised Mr. Foster I would
do and shall be glad to
hear from you your opinion
