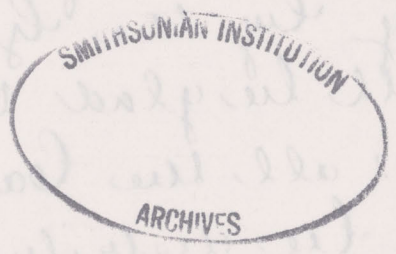
Dear Mr. Dawson,
