Upon unpacking my collections of Seaw-menac Bay fossils I found a few more ferns including the fine specimen collected by my Assistant, Mr. A. P. Low. I propose sending these to you immediately, together with the specimens of Campbellton fishes you kindly lent to

Mr. Whiteaves. He wishes
me to say that he has
not quite done with the
Gasteropods, so if you
will allow us to do so
we will retain them for
the present. The spirorbis
is returned with the
fishes. It is not suffi-
-ciently well preserved
for us to say whether
it is identical with
S. Erianus, or not.

We are sending you for
the McGill College
collection some specimens

of Cheirolepis, & when we
have completed our study
of the Scammanac fishes
we shall be able to spare
also some Acanthodeans.

Whenever you are ready
to have drawings of the
Plants made for you
I shall be happy to
undertake them. May
I ask whether you in-
tend publishing them
in the Survey Reports,
or in one of the Scientific
Journals?
