My dear D^r. Dawson

I do not think you need have any apprehension about the subjects referred to in your letter of the 14th inst.:. There is no intention, so far as I know, to establish a special school of mining. There has been in the Province for some months, a gentleman from France, who has been principally occupied in examining properties for mining purposes when required to do so by private parties. I understand he is also prepared to give instruction to anyone

who may desire it.

As to the Bill concern-
ing the Profession of Surveyors,
Mr. Flynn informs me that it
is mainly a consolidation of the
existing laws. As soon as it is
printed I will send you a copy
for your remarks.

I need only repeat
that I shall be glad at all times
in this as in other matters to
meet your wishes as far as I pos-
sibly can.
