extend as low down as
you have indicated,
but some of the leaves
came in contact with
the rhizome in one or
two places not put
in in the figure; this
can be corrected &

think, without any dif-
ficulty. I will try &
get the fructification
in *A. Jacksoni* corrected.

I see the Artist has
not copied the origi-
-nal faithfully; I have
compared his figure with
the specimen & see it
quite as you do. I am
sorry this mistake
should have occurred.

So soon as the Artist
comes back the printing

if shall be proceeded
with in colour.

I am glad you approve
of the work on the
whole.

I hope you hear good
accounts of your son
& that he is enjoying
his visit to Europe.
