As my special purpose
in this visit is to complete

my material for an ex-
haustive Monograph of
Cozoon, & I hope that after
your meeting is over, you
will be able to discuss
with me certain points
on which I feel difficul-
ties requiring mineralo-
gical knowledge for their
elucidation. In order that
I might thoroughly possess
myself of the case on the
other side, I went over to
Galway three weeks ago, &
discussed King & Kowney's
^{views}~~case~~ with them, - at the
same time showing them
my own. I see plainly that

much turns on the inter-
pretation put on certain
intermediate specimens,
which we have regarded as
the effect of metamorphism
in degrading an original
Eozoon; but which they con-
sider as showing ~~that~~ the
effects of mineralization
in leading up to the typical
Eozoon arrangement. I have
a very good specimen that
shows every gradation be-
tween K & R's 'floculite' and
our 'canal-system'; and I
am now sending it to Row-
ney to ask him if he ac-
cepts this as a test-example.
