My dear Doctor Thomson

In your favour of
b'ing some day to hand. I am
sorry to hear you have forgotten
your promise to me two years
ago of a subscription of \$25
to prepared little Acts books.

It is two years ago last
August when Dr Murray and
I called upon you at your
house in regard to prepared
books when Mrs Mason
spoke very strongly against
the project, but you yourself

said very little about the
matter either for or against
it. Two or three days afterwards
I met you coming out of the
Post office when you referred
to prepared checks and said
to me you can put my
name down for \$25. I

called upon Dr Murray a
short time afterwards and
told him what you said
and he entered your name
in the subscription Book
for the above amount.

I feel quite certain about
the matter and know Dr Murray
will corroborate what I have
said. I send you a copy
of the Postal Card which was
sent to all the subscribers
and which I regret you did

(Little Meets
2 August 1882)

This day a Meeting of subscribers
to the Prohibition Abstract at
Little Meets was held and a
Committee was appointed
consisting of Mr John Thomson

Commodore, and Mr P. Schute
of Quebec; Mr J. B. Savage
and Mr Murray, Montreal; ^{with}
and Messrs J. Ferguson and ^{James}
W. H. Miller, of Melville, with instructions
to obtain plans and specifications
for the proposed works, ^{and}
with power to make the
necessary contracts, ^{and} provided
the whole cost should not exceed
\$800. The Committee was further
instructed to send information
of this resolution to the subdivisions
at a distance
