Dear Dr. Dawson

I have yr two letters. The last of Sept. 25. and am glad to learn that all goes well & that our list of Officers named has been accepted, despite Mr. Boveij's doubt. I shall see Mr. White in a day or two; he is now out of town. The printing goes on slowly, & Mr. Cheam here has made trouble by refusing to sign cheques so that the Government Board has lapsed & requires a five or seven days' warrant to get the

money. We have a council meeting
in Ottawa this week. Danang mat-
ter. Deade has reflected his work.
Chambers has not signed the proofs
yet. Though he has had five proofs
& I fear there is a general dissatis-
faction among the French. I expect
a scene at Ottawa.

paper in the Trans. the Serpent
time paper makes 50 pp. 4^o

I have no special news. Mrs
Ward is very bad in mind & temper
just now. and life with her a great

burden.

We shall do our best with plans for
prospects etc. I met in New York a
week since Dr. Fraser of Philada.
The people here are preparing to do all
in New power for our friends
next year.
