which he has recognized from
the Cincinnati group of Ohio & calls
Batostoma erraticum, Ulrich U.S.

Have a good deal on hand outside of
some work E.S. working up the Wappinger
limestone fossils allied to Tetradium Peacheri
or Solenopora spongioides, Dybowski, which
which I feel pretty certain, having examined
about 30 sections of Canadian & U.S. species
will be the Chaetetes compactus, Billings sp.
which you separated from the sponge
Stromatopora group a good while ago &
so pretty. Then a report on our local
geological features he is in course of prepara-
tion besides various other work in this
much interesting study amongst the
natural sciences - Geology.
