Dear Sir William Dawson

Your letter enclosing the  
P.O. order for the Woodwardian  
testament (which I have  
duly signed and sent to  
the treasurer) has reached  
me here, almost at the  
end of the island and  
among rocks that have more  
than once reminded me  
of last summer. After the  
meeting at Aberdeen my  
sister and I came north-  
ward for a little rest and  
change. Both of which I

needed and she also, as she  
had had a rather busy summer.  
I wanted also to have another  
look at one of the typical sections  
in the Munichian concretion.

I have picked up some useful  
material but the weather is  
simply abominable -

The Aberdeen meeting went off  
well in all respects - number  
2204 - I expect you will  
be at Leeds next year  
at Birmingham - It will be  
pleasant to look on in peace.

As regards my notes on your

specimens - pray do what seems  
best to yourself with them - I think  
however that the paper when complete  
would on the whole be better sent to  
Geol. Mag: as it would form a  
sequel to your contributions  
already published in its pages -

When I get back to London I will  
look at the porphyry which you  
mention - Probably I passed it  
over as obviously igneous - for  
I sliced chiefly there which  
were dubious or were schists -  
Thinking the question of the  
mineral character and



structure of the work the  
important point - If you  
send the paper to Woodward  
I should like to see a proof  
as I might present some  
manuscripts creeping into  
the microscopic part -  
I hope to be in London early  
next month.

With kind remembrance to  
Lady Dawson and your family  
in which my sister joins, and  
in hope of seeing you before
