

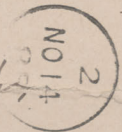

Dear Sir -

I am much obliged for the trouble taken, & information given by you. - Pipes would only apply in general form, & ours vary much in detail. The absence of grooved axes here & at Montreal tends to confirm the Drognaiois tradition of their Montreal origin. Have seen no beads of Uru's here, nor any shell beads on prehistoric sites. L. H. Morgan says that the early Drognaiois used beads of spiral fresh water shells. I presume he means Loniobasis, but none are found, as far as I can learn. The Onondaga wampum belts are clearly quite modern. The longest, which is over five feet long, is certainly a U.S. covernment belt, though reputed to be as old as the League. Long hollow gouges are not rare here, & I have figured many.
