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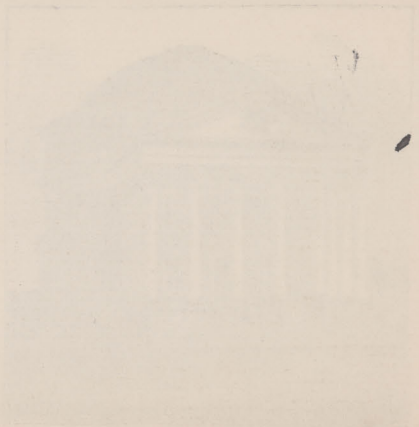
Sir William Dawson,

If you have in print any account of the fossil flora of British Columbia that shows the mingling of Jurassic and Cretaceous types I would be glad to get a copy of it. I have seen only a very brief paragraph stating that you have given a description of such a fossil flora. From what I read, I infer that possibly this flora may have some features similar to that of the younger Mesozoic flora of Virginia, on which I am now working. This shows a peculiar mingling of types. It has some Jurassic types but more of the Wealden, ^{and the Romie} plants described by Heer from Greenland, while a number are closely allied to Schenk's plants from the Wealden beds. With these occur some Angiosperms.
